


Our Past Year at a Glance


The Board of Directors also reviewed the growth of the organization over the past few years and focused on the need for updates to our organizational structure and procedure to reflect the growth. Starting with a Board retreat at the end of 2019 and a follow up retreat in February, 2020, the Board examined every aspect of its vision, mission, and operations in an effort to achieve effective communication and implementation in all its many aspects.

In March, we faced the Covid-19 pandemic and everything changed. The school continued its commitment to keep learning moving forward and quickly implemented online classes. We will continue to meet the challenges of the year to come and look forward to our continued growth and success







A Letter from the School Director

Years ago, when the school was under construction, I descended into the hole where the foundation would lay to take soil for my house plant in order to nurture it and watch it grow along with our school. I touched big rocks before they were buried by the concrete that supports the entire building we now call with affection and pride, The Palapa School. If asked, I would say it is a solidly built school. However, this is just rock and cement, compacted soil and steel. What is under the building, on the walls, on the ceiling is a lot of heart. There is the heartbeat of all who make a contribution because they believe that quality education can change a life. Those of us who work as teachers also believe this. That's why we are here.

The Palapa School

Opened in 2017, The Palapa Secundaria (Middle School) and the Preparatoria (High School) that opened in 2019 are the fulfillment of a dream to create an innovative educational, SEP-certified Middle and High School available to the youth of Todos Santos.

Since its inception, The Palapa School has attracted highly qualified and experienced teachers who provide high-energy learning environments for students to master traditional academic skills and knowledge. With core classes focused on Language, Science, History, and Math, students receive intensive reading and writing instruction in Spanish and in English and have access to computers and a well-equipped science lab. The Palapa students are currently participating in national and statewide competitions and conferences.

Yet, it is more than academics. The Palapa Society's vision is to give students the skills and confidence to live successful lives of fulfillment and contribution. Through progressive teaching techniques and innovative after school clubs and programs, The Palapa School fosters students' curiosity and imagination while igniting their creative spirits. The culture of The Palapa School promotes caring and kindness and lays the foundation for students to become thoughtful, accountable stewards of their families, the community, and the world. More than just classrooms, The Palapa School is a place where learning flourishes and students receive the support, encouragement, and tools they need to blossom into their best selves empowering them to live choice-filled lives and follow their dreams.

The capable and highly motivated students are the Todos Santos community leaders of tomorrow, potentially becoming our future teachers, doctors, accountants, entrepreneurs, artists and more. This success is possible because of the ongoing support and encouragement of the local Todos Santos community and the international supporters and fans who share our vision for a brighter future.









Leadership Club

Students from the Leadership Club mastered the skills and built the confidence to speak to over 350 people at the John Paul Jones fundraiser concert in February 2020. They inspired the audience as they shared their personal stories and dreams for the future.



During the summer of 2019, Paola participated in a study trip to Cairo, Egypt, winning an AFS (American Field Services) scholarship. She was the only 9th grade student to be accepted that year. The scholarship application was thanks to a history class project. Later, when entering tenth grade, motivated by teacher Ana Castillo, her group tutor, she applied to a Teach for All program called SLAC (Student Leader Advisory Council) for 2020. In February, Wendy Kopp, CEO and Founder of Teach for All, notified Paolo of her acceptance. Among 135 countries that applied, Paola is the only student selected this year from Mexico. Her participation in this council is active until March 2021 and made up of just 8 students.

As 10th grade students, and part of the collaboration agreement between The Palapa Society and Enseña por México, these students have access to the network of competitions of this association. All three students applied to participate in a leadership camp to be held in April 2020. Our students were chosen from more than 45 schools submitting applications. Get Inspired is a camp bringing together students who have demonstrated leadership in their schools and communities to continue developing those social leadership skills to positively influence their environment

In May 2019 they participated in the State Science Fair, as eighth graders. Their project focused on electromagnetic waves; the subject of the physics class taught by teacher Xavier Quiroz. The students designed an apparatus that generated this type of wave. In addition to the demonstration, they explained the applications in technological advances for the development within our society. Their presentation was delivered in English and Spanish. This team won first place in its category.

Community Programs

Beca Program: Public School and University Scholarships

This original Palapa Society program is aimed at providing scholarships for local youth to assist with financial requirements of the public schools. For 17 years we have ensured the longevity of this program by continuing to provide tuitions to students of merit and need attending public schools and universities. The program began in 2003 with just 3 scholarships and has grown to 167 annual recipients.





The Puente (Bridge to English) Program

This program, geared towards school-aged youth, currently has 145 students enrolled. Registration for this program is held annually in October and is eagerly received by our local community. Each year, there is an overwhelming response from parents seeking open spots in the program. Puente has four lead teachers and thrives with the help of local volunteers. During the 2019/20 year, Puente added a special class on sea turtles with Susan Farrar. There were many other visitors throughout the year including REI, Root Adventures, The Link School, and many more.

The Palapa Adult English Program

Our Adult English classes follow a similar structure and curriculum. It is geared to older students who have completed the Puente program and adults who wish to enhance their English and increase their employment qualifications. Classes are made up of parents of children who are learning English, plus business owners and employees who interact with the English-speaking community on a regular basis.



Biblioteca Elena Poniatowska (Bilingual Community Library)

ESCUELA DE LA PAL

In November 2017, the library was formally dedicated in the name of world renowned, award-winning author Elena Poniatowska, the "Grande Dame" of Mexican literature. Our library is known as the largest bilingual library in the state of BCS, which includes more than 9,000 books, magazines, and DVD's and serves the entire community.





Biblioteca Infantil Elena Poniatowska (Children's Bilingual Community Library)

The Biblioteca Infantil has a growing collection of books in Spanish and English and includes special programs to help local children develop a lifelong love of reading. This includes the Saturday Reading Circle and Craft Hour where kids create an art project inspired by the story that was read. Since opening in October 2016 over 350 children have signed up for library cards and regularly check out books.



Children's After School Art Program

This creative program has 16 students ages 8-14 with 2 teachers and 2 assistant volunteers. This year we had great success with the ceramic part of the program! The kiln was up and running and students each produced some wonderful first pieces.

The focus of the program is to inspire students' imaginations and allow them to experience different mediums of art.



Water Safety Program

The Water Safety Program, hosted by Mario Surf School, celebrated its 8th year teaching local children proper water safety skills. Each year Mario Becerril and his team teach 15—20 kids for 5 weeks the basics of swimming.

In the first two weeks, the students start at the pool at Hotel Serendipity, donated by the owner and Palapa Board member Sharon Morris. They then graduate to Playa Punta Lobos to apply their skills. Swimming in the Pacific Ocean can be intimidating, but it is critical to learn water safety here, since we live in a beach community.

The programs ends at Playa Los Cerritos with surf lessons.

PLC FOUNDERS SUPPORT: The Palapa School Founders support funding for organizational stability. In FY2018 the PLC Founder Support was \$200K. In FY2020 the PLC Founders Support was able to be cut in half as we had an Excess of Revenue over Operating Expense of \$89K in Calendar Year 2019 and a cumulative FY2020 (18 Months ending on June 30, 2020) surplus of \$95,828 exhibiting excellent Expense management and a growing Donor base.

EARNED INCOME: Includes The Palapa School Tuition and fees from the Biblioteca Elena Poniatowska and English programs.


